Very Catholic	Protestant	Very Protestant
Priests were not allowed to marry. Protestants were persecuted.	Allowed priests to marry and destroyed church decorations.	Henry's daughter (by Katherine of Aragon)- strongly Catholic.
Made himself head of the church and introduced the bible in English.	Called herself 'Governor' instead of head of church and introduced a new prayer book (pleasing Catholics).	Pope was made Head of the Church again, church services in Latin.
Henry's daughter (by Anne Boleyn)- tried to find a balance	Changed church services back to English and allowed priests to marry again (pleasing protestants).	Strongly Protestant. Introduced a new prayer book, held church services in English.
Changed from Catholic to Protestant.	Fair Balance	Did not change church services.
